Titles of papers which do not follow the accepted modern formula have been altered, and in some cases have been expanded to indicate the subject more clearly. All alterations and expansions are shown by the use of square brackets.

The phrase "offprints circulated" is used to denote where offprints were produced from the original blocks without modification. The term "reprinted" is used where new blocks were produced, or where the old blocks were altered in some way, for example by changing the original page numbering.

Note on the Collectanea Antiqua

The various volumes of Smith's Collectanea Antiqua are listed among his books and pamphlets, although they are more of the nature of a privately produced journal in that they comprise a series of articles and papers, not all by Smith himself. Papers by Smith contained therein are individually listed in the inventory of his papers.

The Collectanea were issued in parts at irregular intervals, as and when sufficient material became available. Volumes 1 and 2 were issued in fourteen and nine separate parts respectively. The later volumes were produced in four parts each. Initially, it seems to have been Smith's intention to produce a new part of the Collectanea every quarter, (1) apparently in imitation of the J. Brit. Archaeol. Assoc..

The dating of the various parts of the Collectanea is problematic. As complete volumes, they are usually dated to the year stated on their title pages (as cited in the list of books below). However, the title pages were evidently issued with the final part of each volume, together with the preface, so cannot be used to date the earlier parts. (43) For Volumes IV-VII each individual part was supplied in a temporary brown paper cover, bearing the date of issue, although only rarely do these survive. (45) The only means of dating the parts of the earlier volumes has been by letters of receipt, and reviews in newspapers and journals.

The problem of ascribing individual papers to the original part within each volume has been even more difficult to establish, since nowhere is there a contents list for each individual part. This information had to be derived from a careful examination of reviews and a number of incomplete volumes of the Collectanea, which serve to indicate the range of page numbers of each part. In some copies of Vol. I of the Collectanea, the paper colour and quality varies, which together with Smith's habit of appending notes to the end of each part during proof reading, has helped to establish the ends of some sections. The actual and "official" year of publication of each individual paper is provided using the formula: (year of issue for official year of publication).
